This course will explore cultural processes of unification and disunification. These processes should not be understood as necessarily antithetical but as actually belonging to the dynamism of culture and social coherency. The course will include discussions of globalization, transnationalism, complex connectivity, interzones, rhizomes, and world systems. One of the sources of primary objects will be the European Union, but the question of Europe will be treated critically. Further, students will be asked to consider cultural policy, production, and material culture.
