CLST 2050: CULTURAL STUDIES COMMON SEMINAR: The Erotics of Humanism Paul Bové Wednesdays 5:30-8:30 CL 512

Taking its departure from the Western cultural project of Historical Humanism, this seminar will ask questions about the erotic and affective developments that occur within the processes of humanism's emergence as the cultural dominant within domains of knowledge production, creativity, and species formation. These questions presume that the erotic is both a necessary component in the development of humanism--one of its necessary conditions--and also one of the consequences of that emergence. Readings will move from Plato to Foucault and shall include creative, critical, and theoretical works. The seminar will invite students' contributions from their disciplinary fields and will culminate in a public conference held at end of term.
